

Becoming Beloved Community Book of the Month:



"Trevor Noah's unlikely path from apartheid South Africa to the desk of *The Daily Show* began with a criminal act: his birth. Trevor was born to a white Swiss father and a black Xhosa mother at a time when such

a union was punishable by five years in prison. ... Finally liberated by the end of South Africa's tyrannical white rule, Trevor and his mother set forth on a grand adventure, living openly and freely and embracing the opportunities won by a centuries-long struggle.

The stories collected here are by turns hilarious, dramatic, and deeply affecting. Whether subsisting on caterpillars for dinner during hard times, being thrown from a moving car during an attempted kidnapping, or just trying to survive the life-and-death pitfalls of dating in high school, Trevor illuminates his curious world with an incisive wit and unflinching honesty. His stories weave together to form a moving and searingly funny portrait of a boy making his way through a damaged world in a dangerous time, armed only with a keen sense of humor and a mother's unconventional, unconditional love."

Communion Prayer

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

I know we are in the middle of Stewardship season. As you are asked to give back to the church, realize there are a multitude of ways to do that. Of course, we



know that the church needs our pledges to be able to continue to function. This supports our staff, our building and our mission – as you know, we have experienced inflation over the years, so please consider "inflating" your pledge to help balance that. Also please know that our church also needs us to be good stewards of other gifts that we have been given.

I know, personally, the more I give, the more closeness I feel to God and this community. I have found a variety of ways to serve and so can you. Try things out and see what fits. Over the years, I have tried helping with choir, Vestry, youth (soon youth Sunday school), and the Newcomers Committee. Other ways to volunteer have been

to help lay bricks for the labyrinth, participating in adult formation, and reading in the service. One past opportunity to serve is not going on now, but we can start again if we have interest.

We used to have parishioners available during communion to pray with individuals. I was part of this years ago, and I have to tell you - it was incredible. People don't have to share more than they want, and you don't have to have the answers. You simply offer to pray with them. Of course, we know that we don't need someone else to pray for us to communicate with God. I also know, though, that someone can share God's love with another individual and God will be there. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I with them" is a quote from the Bible, Matthew 18:20.

Please consider if this is something that you are called to help with, and please let the Vestry or Mary Balfour know if it is an offering that you think is needed.

In the recent letter from our Bishop he wrote:

"'Whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple—truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward.' - Matthew 10:41 Let us reveal God in our own gentleness. ... As you let God into your life, give others the grace to allow you into theirs, if and only if they are willing. It takes more strength to move gently. In God you have more strength than you will ever need."

Thank you for listening, may you continue to feel and share God's love.

September 1 through October 4 is the Season of Creation, a time when Christians across the world

collectively and ecumenically practice their gratitude for God's gift of creation. The Season's observance began in 1989 when the Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I proclaimed September 1 as a day of prayer for creation for the Orthodox Church. The World Council on Churches joined with the Orthodox Church in this celebration and extended it from one day to five weeks, culminating with the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi on October 4. For the past several years, Christians of nearly every mainline faith tradition, including the Episcopal Church and the Catholic Church, have recognized the Season of Creation with special liturgies, ecumenical worship services and creation care projects.

We would like take part in that celebration as well. With the guidance of our Creation Care Team, we have chosen to begin the season by offering a devotional for individual and family use at home called Climate + Faith. It will be placed on tables in or near the Nave on Sunday, September 1. We will also mark the beginning of the Season with a special prayer during our worship services. To bring the Season of Creation to a close, on October 6 (the Sunday after St. Francis day), we will hold the 10:30 Rite II service of Morning Prayer outdoors and, since we'll already be dressed down a bit for outdoor worship, we'll take some time to pick up trash around the church property and along Marion Avenue.

Between the beginning and ending of the Season of Creation, we hope you'll carry out the calling of all Christians to care for creation by taking on a few new responsibilities such as:

- > Spend time outdoors taking notice of the beauty and complexity of nature, a sustainable cycle of life, death and resurrection;
- > Use your Climate + Faith devotional daily for inspiration and hope;
- > Educate yourself on the impact of our modern, convenient lifestyles on the natural resources our planet provides.

It is easy to settle into our habits and forget the interdependence between humanity and nature. God created a planet that sustains life through the air we breathe, the water we drink and the plants and animals we eat. But if our lifestyle

damages those precious resources, in the longterm we will suffer too. Our planet will no longer be able to sustain life as we know and enjoy it. Caring for creation means that we are mindful of this fragile connection between all created things and that we do our part to see that it is sustainable for generations to come. We have often provided ideas and suggestions for individuals to practice creation care over the past year. Please use this Season of Creation to take at least one more step towards conservation of God's natural gifts. There will be an insert in the September 1 bulletin with a list of simple ways anyone can become a better steward.

We have reserved the group campsite at North Mills River near Brevard, NC that can accommodate 30 people. You are welcome to come for one or both nights.




