There are many other events during the weeks, all included in this issue!


May we find hope, peace, joy and love this Advent season.

Becoming Beloved Community

Book of the Month:

Many of us grew up hearing Luke's narrative of Jesus' birth and, as naïve children, imagined a baby Jesus



with white skin. As we learned from James Romaine's presentations on religious art of the Renaissance, most early works of art depicted Jesus with light skin, drawing on an ethnocentric perspective and false assumptions about race and human worth. Though we've gained greater understanding about the likely circumstances of Jesus' birth, there is still much we don't know and likely never will know. But it's essential that we incorporate our new learning into the old stories, recognizing that Jesus did not look very much like us (white people) at all. This beautiful retelling of the nativity story by Dorena Williamson seeks to do just that. Brown Baby Jesus weaves the birth narrative into the larger picture of Jesus' ancestry, connecting him to many nations and peoples, past, present and future. We see Jesus as the great deliverer of all people and celebrate the promise of his message, "By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace." Luke 1:78-79.

Brown Baby Jesus is available for borrowing, along with many other titles, from our Becoming Beloved Community Library in the Gathering Space!




Our CO3R
